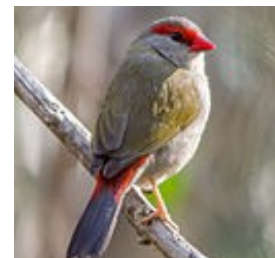


# Common Birds in Tilligerry Habitat

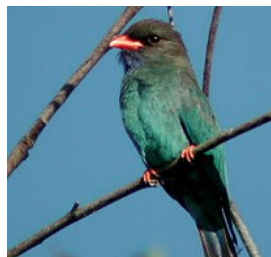
A special mention here ... In 2007 a Godwit was tracked with longest non-stop flight of over 11,000km in 9 days from NZ to China!

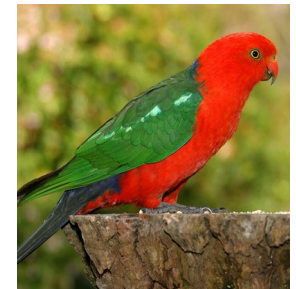

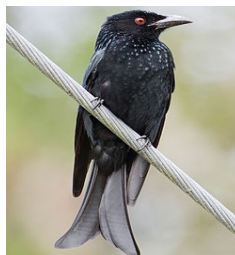

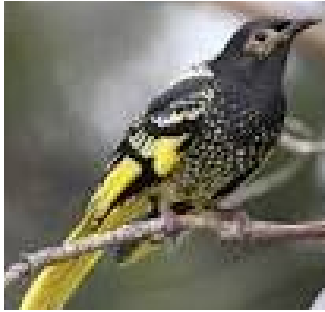

# Threatened Species



**Regent Honeyeater**

Critically endangered. **Hunter Valley Important Bird Area** is vital for the survival of this flagship species



**Osprey**

Listed as vulnerable on the NSW coast



**Beach Stone-curlew**

One of the world's largest shorebirds, classified as Near Threatened on the IUCN Red List of Threatened Species



**Sooty Oystercatcher**

Prefers rocky coastlines, but will occasionally live in estuaries. Listed as endangered in New South Wales



**Australian Pied Oystercatcher**

Listed as endangered in NSW. Recognized by the 5–8 cm long orange-red beak, slender pink legs and black and white plumage



**Swift Parrot**

May face extinction by 2031 due to predation and loss of habitat. **Hunter Valley Important Bird Area** is vital for the survival of this species
